GUIDELINES FOR GREEN ENERGY ALTERNATIVES PROJECTS



SOLAR ENERGY:

Solar panels/equipment shall require written application and approval by RLPOA Architectural Review Board prior to installation.

Any solar panels and related appurtenances and equipment shall be designed and constructed to appear as an integrated part of the building architecture.

Panels shall be roof mounted so that the top surface is as flush with the roof whenever possible, with all appurtenances recessed into the structure's attic. Solar panels should be black with black trim.

Solar panels should be located on the rear or side roof of a home whenever possible.

No ground level applications will be considered.

A Photovoltaic System Application must be submitted to and approved by the City of Lee's Summit prior to installation. Copy of approval must be submitted to the RLPOA Administrative Office. *Board approved 8/11/15.*





Dock Rules:

- (a) No Swimming from Docks. Due to safety concerns, Courtesy Docks are for loading and unloading boats. No fishing or swimming shall be allowed from any courtesy docks. A citation will be issued for failure to adhere.
- **(b)** Due to safety concerns, **swim docks** are for swimming and sunbathing only and are open during the season from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily. Other activities on the swim docks will receive a citation for failure to adhere. Furthermore, no vessels shall be operated, or permitted to drift into designated swim areas. This is a 4th level offense for motorized watercraft resulting in 90-day suspension, loss of all current boat permits, and \$100 fine. Board approved November 14, 2006. For non-motorized watercraft this is a violation that will result in:
- (a) First (1st) violation -written warning.
- (b) Second (2nd) violation suspension from lake for remainder of day and a \$10.00 fine.
- (c) Third (3rd) violation suspension from lake for the remainder of the day, plus a suspension from lake for seven (7) days and a \$25.00 fine.
- (d) Fourth (4th) violation suspension from the lake for remainder of day plus a 90 (ninety) day suspension, loss of all current boat permits and a \$100.00 fine.
- (c) Leased Slips are for leaseholders only. No trespassing at any time unless accompanied by a leaseholder of that dock or is in possession of the leaseholder of that dock's Raintree Resident ID card. Members are responsible for their guests. Due to safety concerns, no swimming or fishing is allowed from the docks. Board approved June 14, 2005.

Lake Committee Reminder of the Month:


WATER SKI RULES:

The following rules shall govern all water-ski activities on the lake:

1. Areas:

Skiing is permitted in all Raintree Lake areas except the following:

- (a) Within fifty (50) feet of any boat or dock.
- (b) Within seventy-five (75) feet of any designated swim area.
- (c) Within seventy-five (75) feet of any land or any swimmer.
- (d) Any prohibited areas marked by the Association with buoys.
- (e) The Area West of Ward Road called 'Raintree Reserves'.



Section (c) was placed into this rule for a number of reasons. Obviously we wanted to protect swimmers which are defined as anyone in the water. Swimming without the protection of a red or orange flag displayed is permitted within 50 feet of shore. This includes wading, relaxing on a floatable or any other activity a resident may want to accomplish within that 50 feet.

A secondary reason is that many areas of the shoreline have gradually tapering depths or flats that can extend within the restricted 75 feet. During our heavy rains, debris enters the lake and even though we have barriers to retain the debris at all inflows, some debris does get by. Also, due to the high flow of water through the lake, some fish attractors may be moved. Some of this debris and possibly a fish attractor may collect below the surface on these flats. If a skier were to fall where some debris or branches had collected or even into one of the more shallow areas there is a possibility of injury.

Yard of the Month Program

Congratulations to all the residents who won Yard of the Month in 2015. Just a reminder regarding the program: it started in 1998, so 2016 will be the 19th year for the program. Yard of the Month has been modified to recognize three (3) yards per month for the months of June, July and August (one on the North Side, one on the South Side, and one in the Maintenance Free areas which includes the Villas, Fountains and Cobblestone) for a total of nine (9) winners each year. Also, anyone who has not won in the last five (5) years is eligible. The award is for well-maintained front and/or back yards. Homes that are delinquent on association dues are not eligible for the award. Winners get a Yard-of-the-Month sign posted in their yards, a \$50 gift certificate for a local Nursery and, best of all bragging rights on their streets.

Continue to keep your yards nice because you never know if the Common Ground Committee will be knocking on your door in 2016!

SOUND OFF!

To all slip holders: There has been an ongoing problem with electricity to the docks. To help remedy the situation, please keep the plastic waterproof covers closed at all times. Even when you are plugged into the outlet, the cord(s) can be pulled through the bottom of the cover and the cover can then be snapped securely back in place. Also, when you unplug, remember to replace the cover and snap it tightly in place. The waterproof covers are designed to keep water from the outlets which will help keep electricity flowing. Your assistance is greatly appreciated! Thanks!

7 Home Winterization Tips



By taking a few simple, yet crucial, steps this fall to prepare your home for the frigid winter temperatures, you'll enjoy peace of mind all winter long. When it comes to home ownership, a little preparedness goes a long way. With the crisp autumn air surrounding you, fall is the perfect time to winterize your home.

You don't have to be a professional contractor, or even overly handy to get your home ready for winter; all you need is a starting point. Let's start here, with these **seven home winterization tips:**

Clean The Gutters - While beautiful and serene, those falling leaves are nothing but bad news for your gutter system. The good news is that cleaning your gutters is a quick and easy task. The worst part about gutter cleaning is remembering to do it.

Insulate Your Attic - Warning: The upfront price tag to insulate your attic may sting a little. However, this investment immediately pays for itself. Between the lower utility bills and reduced energy consumption, insulating (or adding more insulation to) your attic is a win-win. As you're pricing out insulation for your attic, keep in mind that you'll need a minimum of 12-inches. Not sure if your attic needs additional insulation?

Well, here's a quick test: when looking into your attic, can you see the ceiling joists? No? Well, then you're good to go! If you can see them, it's time to add a layer of insulation. If you're going to be layering your insulation, (i.e. adding a blanket of insulation atop an existing layer) you'll want to stay away from using any type of insulation with paper backing, as it can lead to serious moisture issues and potential mold growth.

Test Your Furnace - Even if you plan on keeping your windows open this fall, give your furnace a quick test-run to ensure everything is in proper order. After all, it's best to find out there is an issue now, while the weather is still mild, than mid-January when temperatures are below freezing. When testing your furnace this fall, don't be alarmed if you notice a strong burst of strange odors – they're perfectly normal and harmless! However, if those "odd odors" last longer than expected, or continue to develop, shut the furnace down and contact an HVAC professional to assist. If everything seems to be in working order during your test run, all you'll have to do is check your stock of furnace filters. If you're running low, head to your local hardware store to pick up a few. Remember: furnace filters should be changed every month to increase efficiency and prolong the life of your entire heating system.

Repair Ducts - According to the <u>U.S. Department of Energy</u>, if ductwork is not well-insulated, or properly connected or routed, homes with central heating may lose up to 60% of heated air, before reaching vents. Wow – that's a cold house, and an outrageously <u>expensive energy bill</u>, folks. While ducts aren't always easy to spot, you'll usually find them in the attic, the basement, and in crawlspaces. Repairs should be made to ducts with pinched pipes and gaps. Additionally, you may want to add duct vacuuming to your <u>home maintenance checklist</u> – this should be done every 2-3 years. Duct vacuuming is ideal for improving air quality, as it removes built-up dust, gunk, and animal hair.

Reverse Ceiling Fans - Most homeowners forget about this simple task – but it really shouldn't be overlooked. Reversing the direction of your ceiling fans pushes warm air downward, forcing it to re-circulate.

Wrap Pipes - Freezing temps lead to more than chilly nights and snowball fights, they also lead to burst pipes and <u>water damage</u>. To keep pipes in perfect shape all winter long, wrap them with a pre-molded sleeve (foam, rubber, or fiberglass insulation materials are ideal for wrapping). If you're combating seriously cold temperatures, or are dealing with a pipe that has issues every season, wrap it first with heating tape.

Check Smoke Alarms & Carbon Monoxide Detectors - As you "Fall Back" for daylight savings time, spend a few minutes of that extra hour changing the batteries in your home's <u>smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors</u>, then test them. While you're at it, take a look at your fire extinguishers – are they expired? If so, it is time to replace them.

Formation of a Pond Committee



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
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
