"Boats in the Driveway" Question Passed!

At the Annual Meeting, residents voted to allow watercraft and their boat trailers to be parked in the driveway during the boating season from April 1 to Oct. 31st.

A few rules to follow: 1) watercraft has to be in **operable condition** 2) bearing a **current Raintree Sticker** and 3) resident must be in good standing.

The 72-hour rule will be enforced for: Watercraft that are inoperable, watercraft without current stickers, trailers without current stickers, any watercraft that is not allowed on Raintree Lake. Should you have any questions, contact the office at 537-7576.

The Board wants you to be aware that you should **secure any items that may be stored in your watercraft.** With the potential of theft, do not be an easy target. Secure your valuables!

Our annual Lake Clean-Up is planned as a family activity to clean up our shoreline and neighborhood.


Saturday, May 20, 2017 9:00 A.M. – Noon

Raintree Lake Memorial Day Fishing Derby Monday, May 29th, 2017





RAINTREE LAKE POOL RULES

Pool capacity-235

- 1. Persons using the pool agree to abide by the directions of the lifeguards and/or manager on duty.
- 2. No person with open cuts, sores, lesions, infections, obvious communicable disease or diarrhea shall use the swimming pool.
- 3. No alcoholic beverages, narcotics or drugs of any kind shall be allowed in the pool area.
- 4. Animals are not allowed in or around the swimming pool; unless they are a trained guide dog.
- 5. Resident ID cards (2 years and older) are required by all to enter the pool.
- 6. Residents will receive single day guest credits (quantity to be determined by Board of Directors each year) per lot per pool season to be used at their discretion. Maximum of 10 guest credits can be carried over from previous year. Single day guest passes will be available to purchase in blocks of 10 for a \$20.00 fee at RLPOA office.
- 7. All guests will be accompanied by a Raintree resident at all times.
- 8. All guests ages sixty-five (65) and above and two (2) and younger will be free of charge but must be accompanied by a Raintree resident at all times.
- 9. Baby-sitters: Non-Resident passes
 - a. Must be at least fourteen (14) years of age.
 - b. Quantity of one (1) babysitter pass/non-resident pass will be available per season per lot. ID must be made at RLPOA office.
 - c. Flat fee for babysitter/non-resident will be \$20.00.
 - d. Permission slip signed by resident and babysitter/non-resident must be on file.
 - e. ID Card will be issued to babysitter/non-resident and is required to enter the pool.
- 10. Raintree residents are responsible for their cards. No cards will be kept on file. Additional or replacement cards may be purchased in the office for \$5.00 each.
- 11. Resident children under ten (10) years of age must be accompanied by a Raintree resident fourteen (14) years of age or older. *Amended March* 24, 2005
- 12. Pool Hours:

Mon thru Sunday 10:30 AM - 9:00 PM

Thurs..........10:30 AM – 8:00 PM (unless scheduled swim meet) (Adult swim 8 PM -10 PM)

Note: Adult swim is to be 18 years of age and older.

- 13. No swim lessons will be available at the pool.
- 14. Resident Grandparents: Visiting grandchildren up to 18 years of age, may use the swimming pool on your resident ID card, but must be accompanied by you while at the pool.
- 15. Diving is prohibited.
- 16. Proper swim attire required. No cut-offs in the pool.
- 17. Children who are not toilet trained shall wear tight fitting plastic underwear or swim diapers that will prevent leakage.
- 18. No running or pushing on pool deck.
- 19. No gum or food in pool. Food is allowed on pool deck.
- 20. No glass in pool area. All beverages and suntan lotions must be in aluminum or plastic containers.
- 21. Swimming after pool hours is prohibited. Violators will be restricted from using the pool and prosecuted due to trespassing.
- 22. No rafts or inflatable flotation devices in the pool, with the exception of water wings.
- 23. No squirt guns of any type and/or style.
- 24. Pool games are left to the discretion of the lifeguard or manager on duty. No overhand throwing of any pool toy and/or object.
- 25. The rope floats that separate the deep water from the shallow are there for safety purposes and are not to be hung on.
- 26. No talking with the lifeguard while on duty.
- 27. Any resident or their guests using profanity, verbal abuse, or threats to any lifeguard, pool or RLPOA personnel will lose pool privileges for ninety (90) days (carried over to the next season) plus a \$100 fine. (Note: Residents are responsible for their guests at all times). *Policy approved June 2002. Amended March 24*, 2005.

WATER SLIDE RULES

- 1. Children under forty-eight (48) inches tall must be accompanied by an adult or wear a coast guard approved life jacket.
- 2. Only one rider on the slide at a time, unless the young child is accompanied by an adult.
- 3. Slide must be ridden with feet entering water first.
- 4. Riders must wait for the attendant's "start signal" before starting the ride.
- 5. Keep arms and hands inside at all times.
- 6. Do not run, dive, stand, kneel, or stop in the slide.
- 7. At the end of the slide, swim to stairs and exit area quickly.
- 8. CAUTION: For safety reasons, pregnant women and persons with heart conditions or back trouble should not ride this slide.
- 9. No toys may be taken down the slide.

Boat Ramp Gate Procedures

The gate at the boat ramp is intended to serve as a reminder that every boater at Raintree is responsible for the health of our lake. During primary boating season (May 1 - September 30) the gate will be monitored by the Lake Patrol. On high traffic days the Lake Patrol and members of the Lake Committee may conduct random inquiries and inspections of boats entering the lake. They will also provide additional educational information.

There were two reasons for the gate: trespassers and invasive species control. Trespassing boaters have been relatively minimal, but they cause a fair amount of concern. Dealing with trespassers is always an uncomfortable experience for all involved. A locked gate is expected to send a very clear message to would-be trespassers. Remember the gate code changes May 1! Contact the office if you have not received the code with your 2017 Boat Stickers.

The second reason, invasive species control, is a much more significant challenge that could affect all residents. The invasive species of most concern to the Lake Committee and the Board is zebra mussels. Zebra mussels can cause significant damage to boats and structures in the lake as well as injury to swimmers—all of which has the potential to reduce property values in our community.


Zebra mussels have few known predators and reproduce at incredible rates. A single female zebra mussel can reproduce a million eggs each year. Zebra mussels are not visible to the naked eye in their larvae stage, known as veligers. Zebra mussels have been identified at a number of locations in Missouri and Kansas. They are yet to be found in Raintree Lake.

Many surrounding private lakes have implemented very restrictive quarantine policies to reduce the possibility of transmission from infested waters. These lakes tend to be smaller, have lower percentages of trailered boats and have significant space available for designated quarantine areas. This approach appears to be less practical for application at Raintree Lake. Our approach is focused on the education of our community members.

Key points to remember: CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY, DISPOSE

Cleaning with water heated to 140°F instantly kills mussels. The Boat/Truck wash next to Casey's in Greenwood is set to a minimum of 140°F and is recommended for use by all boats that have been in infested waters prior to re-entry into Raintree Lake.

In addition to cleaning and drying the boat, special attention should be paid to trailers, bilges, live wells, ballast tanks, bait buckets, fat sacks, life jackets, tubes, wakeboards, skis, ropes, wet suits and any other gear that has been in infested waters to ensure that they are thoroughly cleaned and dried as well.

NEW BOAT ON RAINTREE LAKE???

VERIFICATION PROCESS FOR A BOAT THAT HAS NEVER BEEN ON RAINTREE LAKE:

Resident must provide title, registration or bill of sale to verify ownership of watercraft. If you have not taken a safety test, this will need to be done in the office. If you have never watched our Raintree Water Patrol video (new residents) then this must also be done. It takes about 15 minutes for video and 30 minutes for the test.

FOR MOTORIZED: Please have your insurance carrier provide us a Policy declaration sheet showing at least \$100,000 minimum liability insurance with Raintree Lake Property Owners Association and the address of 825 SW Raintree Drive, Lee's Summit, MO 64082 listed as an additional interested party. This allows the insurance carrier to notify the Raintree Lake office when policies are updated or cancelled.

FOR NON-MOTORIZED: Please have your insurance carrier provide us a copy of your Home Owners Insurance policy showing the policy number and the coverage dates. *Our fax number is 816-537-5621 or email to office@rlpoa.com*

After these items have been submitted to the RLPOA office we will create an application for stickers and a verification form for the Water Patrol to inspect your watercraft. Please allow 5 business days before setting up an appointment with the Water Patrol to have your boat verified. (Water Patrol # 816-520-3893 or 816-537-7576.)

PLEASE NOTE: Personal water craft do not need to be verified. Non-motorized boats i.e.: canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, paddle boats and non-towable floating device also do not need to be verified. **Motor boats, pontoons, sail boats and any vessel with a trolling motor would need to be verified.**

Once the Water Patrol has verified your watercraft, Water Patrol will turn your paperwork into the office and you will be able to come in and get your stickers.

Help us help you by planning ahead! This process can take time for the office to process paperwork during the busy months of summer. Your patience is greatly appreciated!! Thank you!

Boating Safety Test: Who has to take it this year?



If you are a new boater on Raintree Lake, if you have an odd lot number (lot number, not street address), anyone receiving a boating violation last year, or if you are planning on renting the pontoon, you will have to come to the office and take the open book safety test. It will take approximately thirty minutes to

take the test. Just come in during office hours and take care of it! See you soon!

When Should You Call 911?

A good rule of thumb is to dial 911 when someone's life, safety, health or property is in immediate jeopardy. This would include most crimes, suspicious persons or vehicles, disturbances, fights, people with weapons, suicidal persons, or any incident involving someone having a dangerous mental or emotional episode. Follow your gut instinct. If it doesn't feel right or look right, dial 911. The Lee's Summit Police would rather answer a call that turns in to nothing than stop by your home several hours later asking you if you saw or heard anything. Sometimes the person investigated is doing nothing wrong at the time, but has warrants. Your call gets that person off the street.

If you doubt yourself at all, dial the non-emergency phone number (969-7390). The dispatcher will assist you with any questions you have.

Finally, an officer may not respond in what you think is a timely manner. The officers may be very busy at that time and higher priority calls are answered first. If you want to be contacted when the officer does arrive, please tell the dispatcher when you are talking to them. If the officer responding to your suspicious vehicle call doesn't make any contact with that vehicle, they will go on to the next call. If you dial 911 and then change your mind, do not hang up. The dispatcher will call you back to check on you. If you fail to answer, an officer will appear at your door to check on your well being.

10-Day List Reminder!! Section 7. Parking of Motor Vehicles, Boat and Trailers. No trucks or commercial vehicles, boats, or other similar water-borne vehicles, house trailers, boat trailers, trailers of every other description, campers or camping units shall be permitted to be parked or to be stored on any Lot, nor shall any inoperative vehicle of any type be parked or stored on any Lot for more than 72 hours unless they are parked or stored in an enclosed garage or in such other enclosure approved by the Architectural Review Board, except only during periods of approved construction on the Lot. This prohibition of parking shall not apply to temporary parking of trucks and commercial vehicles, such as for pick-up, delivery, and other commercial services. (pages 50 & 51 of Raintree Directory)

Should more than 72 hours be needed, each residence is allowed (two times a year) to be put on a "10-day list" to extend that time. Just call the office and we will take care of it! For those who are past the 72 hours and are not on the "10-day list", our Raintree Codes Compliance Officer will take a picture that is date and time stamped and send a warning letter. The letter gives the resident five days from the date of the letter to resolve the situation. Should the situation remain unresolved, the resident will receive a second letter, informing them that a \$500 fine has been assessed.

Why the \$500 fine? In the past, some residents chose to leave their boat/trailer, etc. on the driveway through the winter months, incurring Raintree fines, which turned out to be a more cost-effective choice for the residents than to pay to store elsewhere. So, in response, the Raintree Board of Directors chose to raise the fine to \$500 to prevent this situation in the future. Remember, for any fine—You have the right to appeal!

Should you have guestions, the Raintree Office is the best place to receive guidance. Give us a call at 537-7576!

NOTE: The above quoted rule, specifically regarding boats and boat trailers, is voted upon each year by Raintree residents. The vote to waive this part of the rule passed again this year! So, a Raintree resident in good standing, with a watercraft that is in operable condition, bearing a current Raintree Sticker (on watercraft and trailer), may have their boat and/or boat trailer on their driveway between April 1st and October 31st. See page 3 for the complete ruling.

Trash and/or yard waste containers shall not be permitted to remain visible from the street except on resident's day of trash collection. If necessary, these containers may be placed at the curb AFTER DARK the night before collection. Yard waste including branches, must be kept to the side or behind the residence out of sight or view of the street, until day of pick up or after dark the night before. Yard waste may not be left out more than one week on side or back of house. Storing of trash and/or yard waste containers (full or empty) shall not be permitted to remain where they are visible from the street at any time. Violations of these rules will result in a warning for the first offense and a fine of \$10.00 for each succeeding violation. Each day may be deemed to be a separate offense. *Amended by the Board of Directors September 14, 2004. Located under "MISCELLANEOUS,"* page 86 of the Raintree Directory

Preservation of Property With this nice weather, the Raintree Codes will begin to look for properties that are needing maintenance to their properties. Things that are looked for: rotting wood, broken windows, peeling paint, decks that are falling apart, etc. If you have a Preservation of Property violation, you will receive a warning in the mail and a time frame for work to be accomplished. Some of these improvements will need an application filled out for the Architectural Review Board to approve before starting the work. Please contact the office with questions—537-7576.





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
