



# **Babysitter—Caregiver—House Sitter Pass**

Babysitter passes, Caregiver passes, and House Sitter Passes are available for \$50.00 in the Raintree Office for the 2019 Pool Season. These passes are for the holder only and do not allow the holder to bring in their own guests. A Raintree homeowner must come to the office to fill out the necessary paperwork before pass will be granted. The office accepts payment of cash or check.



#### **Pool Guest Credit Q & A:**

Q:How do I get Guest Credits to use at the pool?

A:Ten Guest Credits are given to each Raintree household each year. Also, up to 10 Guest Credits, that remained unused from the previous year, can be brought forward to this year. So, each household has the possibility of having 20 guest credits for use at the beginning of the season. These credits are loaded electronically in the office and reduced electronically by pool employees when a member of your household brings in guests.

Q:What if I run out of Guest Credits?

A:Additional Guest Credits can be purchased in the Raintree Office (NOT AT THE POOL) for \$2.00 each, in lots of 10. So for \$20.00 you receive 10 Guest Credits. Any Guest Credits that are purchased and not used will be brought forward to the next year.

Remember that you must stay with, and are responsible for, any guest you bring to the pool. Also, please remember that dues must be up-to-date in order to use the pool.

## 8 Quiet Signs of Someone Drowning

Find out the real warning signs that someone is in trouble in the water from mariovittone.com

Drowning is the second-most common cause of accidental death in children ages 1 to 14 (just behind motor vehicle accidents). In a 2004 study by a national safety group, 90 percent of children who drowned did so while under the care of an adult or a teenager. In many cases, the study suggests, that person had a momentary lapse of attention. But the fact is that often those watching don't know what to look for—because drowning doesn't look like drowning. To ward off a tragedy in the making, watch for the 8 signs that someone is in trouble.

- 1. A drowning person can't call for help—she has to be able to breathe before she can speak. When a person is drowning, her mouth sinks below and reappears above the surface of the water. There isn't time for her to exhale, inhale, and call out.
- 2. She can't wave for help either. A drowning person instinctively extends her arms to the sides and presses down to lift her mouth out of the water; a child may extend her arms forward. She can't use her arms to move toward a rescuer or reach for rescue equipment.
- 3. A drowning person remains upright in the water, with no evidence of kicking. She can struggle for only 20 to 60 seconds before going under.
- 4. Eyes are glassy, unable to focus, or closed.
- 5. Hair may be over forehead or eyes.
- 6. Head is low in the water, with mouth at water level; head may be tilted back with mouth open. A child's head may fall forward.
- 7. Sometimes the most important indicator that someone is drowning is that she doesn't look like she's drowning. She may just seem to be looking up at the sky, shore, pool deck, or dock. Ask her, "Are you all right?" If she can answer at all, she probably is okay. If she returns a blank stare, you may have less than 30 seconds to get to her.
- 8. Children playing in the water make noise. When they get quiet, you need to get to them and find out why.













# Raintree Pool Info: Reasons for the 15-Minute Swim Break

The last 15 minutes of each hour at the Raintree Pool have been deemed a Swim Break—which is for SAFETY REASONS. This is a time for the pool to be emptied so

lifeguards can view a clear pool, take a break from their duties, hydrate and rotate positions. During this time only adults, 18 years and older, may be in the pool, and the pool manager assumes the duties of lifeguard during that time.

Those under 18 years old may sit around the perimeter of the pool only.

Although this may be inconvenient for those at the pool, it is necessary for the safety of all residents and staff.

# REMINDER: RAINTREE POOL AND SWIMMING LESSONS

PARENTS: Feel free to teach your children to swim at the Raintree pool! You can also teach the neighbor and a cousin and the cousin's friend. **BUT YOU CANNOT CHARGE FOR IT!** 

What is not allowed is swim lessons being conducted as a business at the Raintree pool.

This is not just a pool thing. Conducting a private business on the lake, or in one of the buildings, or on common ground is also not allowed. Private business on common property is not allowed because it creates a liability for the RLPOA.

Raintree could contract to offer swim lessons in the future. However, between Swim Team practice and then swim lessons, the pool would be tied up until much later each day, making open swim begin at noon instead of 10:30 each day. Because of this, and that there are so many other options for swim lessons in the area, Raintree has chosen not to offer swim lessons at the pool at this time.

#### Report Illegal Dumping & Illicit Discharge

It is a violation of City ordinance to dump, sweep, or discard any materials, litter, or trash into the City's right-of-way, storm drainage system, or public property. Such items include:

leaves, yard waste, limbs, branches

trash

concrete, wet or dry

paint

oil

grease

fireworks

waste water

Materials illegally dumped in the storm drainage system (also known as an Illicit Discharge) not only block the system, causing localized flooding, but also cause or contribute to water pollution.

To report illegal dumping or illicit discharges, notify the Public Works Department by calling 816.969.1800 or include the street name and nearest intersecting street in LSConnect.

# PREVENT ZEBRA MUSSELS!

Please do not take your boat and trailer to ANY OTHER body of water and then bring it back to Raintree Lake without following the Zebra Mussel prevention regulations. Cleaning requires a power wash, including the trailer with heated water and a quarantine/drying period. Washing alone is not sufficient due to the residual water left in live wells, the bilge, ballast tanks, and other compartments. The only safe procedure is to have your watercraft sit out for the appropriate time to dry. The quarantine time for the months of June through September is 7 days.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) advises that 104° F water, typical of a normal car wash, is adequate to kill Zebra Mussels with a 20 minute exposure of the hot water, and 140° F is adequate to kill Zebra Mussels with a 10 second exposure. The Greenwood Car Wash at 1103 W. Main St. (next to Casey's) has a bay that has been retrofitted to produce 140° F water at the wash nozzle - the east bay (the bay closest to Casey's.) This Boat Wash bay is currently the only known 140° F power wash station available in our area for residents to use for watercraft washing. Please take the potential threat of zebra mussels seriously. If you have any questions, please contact the Raintree Office at 537-7576.

Spread the Message - Not the Mussel!!

- Do you know what house plant performs photosynthesis under minimal light and is advisable to keep in the bedroom?
  - · The Snake Plant. It produces oxygen during the night.
- Do you know while camping what helps keep mosquitoes & other bugs away?
  - Add Sage or Rosemary to your campfire.
- Do you know the difference between a Male and a Female Bell Pepper?
  - The Male Pepper has 3 bumps and is better for cooking. The Female Pepper has 4 bumps and is sweeter and better for eating raw.
- Do you know what vegetables should be stored at room temperature in an open container?

#### Protect our oak trees: Get rid of rhododendrons, even healthy ones, bought from Walmart

KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE



A disease has been found in Kansas with the potential to kill a number of our local native species, including oak trees. The source of the disease is infected plants shipped from an Oklahoma nursery to Walmart stores throughout the Kansas City area. The Kansas Department of Agriculture and K-State Extension made the announcement after samples tested positive on June 7.

Container-grown rhododendrons shipped to Walmart are the source of the pathogen Phytophythora ramorum. The disease is called Ramorum blight in landscape plants and Sudden Oak Death in oak trees. If you purchased any rhododendron plants from an area Walmart this spring, please take action immediately. All parts of the plants must be destroyed to prevent the spread of the disease. Dig up the plant, including the root ball and soil, and double bag it in plastic. Place in the garbage to be buried in the landfill. Even healthy looking plants should be removed as they are still carriers of the disease. Do not take the plants back to Walmart as this increases the chance of disease transmission. If seeking a refund, bring your receipt instead.

Tools used to remove the plant — such as shovels, pruners, shoes, gloves or any other materials that may come in contact with the plants during the removal process — should be sanitized to reduce the spread. Sanitize garden tools with either a 10% bleach solution or by thoroughly wiping down all surfaces with rubbing alcohol. Wash gloves and clothing as well.

Sudden Oak Death is not new to the United States. The disease has caused damage in susceptible trees for nearly 15 years in California, Washington and Oregon. In Kansas and Missouri, this disease could spread due to our moist weather patterns and increased number of native oak trees.

Kansas City area forests contain trees of both the white oak group and the red oak group. The white oak group species with rounded lobed leaves, such as Bur oak, are less susceptible to the disease. The greatest concern is for the red oak group with pointed leaf lobes. Species in the red oak group include red, black, pin, Shumard, blackjack and shingle. Many of the best street trees in our area are red oak species, and the disease will affect native forest and landscape trees alike.

Ramorum blight can be difficult to identify. Symptoms on the nursery plants include leaf spotting or browning and stem dieback. These symptoms are easily confused with common problems such as environmental stress and other pest issues. Landscape shrubs rarely die from the disease but increase the spread. Symptoms in oak trees include bleeding cankers on the trunk, leading to decline and death.

Take action now if you purchased rhododendrons from Walmart this spring to remove and discard them immediately.



#### Fire Pits 101 Provided by City of LS Fire Dept.

Summer evenings wouldn't be complete without good friends, great food and possibly a fire in an outdoor fire pit. Sounds like fun, but in the interest of safety, the Fire Department urges citizens to have the proper permits before starting up the fire pit. Permits can be obtained from the Fire Department free of charge, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Mon. - Fri.

Here's what you need to know about recreational fires.

#### What is a recreational fire?

A fire contained in a ring of bricks/stones, such as a campfire or in a fire pit (not in a closed device).

#### Do I need a permit for a recreational fire?

Yes. A new permit is required for each fire. A free permit can be obtained from the Lee's Summit Fire Department. Subsequent permits can be requested by phone.

#### Are there limitations or requirements for a recreational fire?

Recreational fires are limited in size. The woodpile cannot be larger than three feet in diameter and two feet in height. Only seasoned firewood may be used. No yard waste, lumber or trash is allowed. Fires must be a minimum of 25 feet from structures or combustible materials, unless approved.
