
Raintree I.D. Troubles?

No need to fret, the Raintree Office can help!

To replace a LOST card, \$5.00 will get you a new one! The office accepts cash or check only!

To replace a ruined card, bring what is left and you will receive a replacement at no cost to you!



Pool Guest Credit Q & A:

Q:How do I get Guest Credits to use at the pool?

A:Ten Guest Credits are given to each Raintree household each year. Also, up to 10 Guest Credits, that remained unused from the previous year, can be brought forward to this year. So, each household has the possibility of having 20 guest credits for use at the beginning of the season. These credits are loaded electronically in the office and reduced electronically by pool employees when a member of your household brings in guests.

Q:What if I run out of Guest Credits?

A:Additional Guest Credits can be purchased in the Raintree Office (NOT AT THE POOL) for \$2.00 each, in lots of 10. So for \$20.00 you receive 10 Guest Credits. Any Guest Credits that are purchased and not used will be brought forward to the next year.

Remember that you must stay with, and are responsible for, any guest you bring to the pool.

Also, please remember that dues must be up-to-date in order to use the pool.

REMINDER: RAINTREE POOL AND SWIMMING LESSONS

PARENTS: Feel free to teach your children to swim at the Raintree pool! You can also teach the neighbor and a cousin and the cousin's friend. **BUT YOU CANNOT CHARGE FOR IT!**

What is not allowed is swim lessons being conducted as a business at the Raintree pool.

This is not just a pool thing. Conducting a private business on the lake, or in one of the buildings, or on common ground is also not allowed. Private business on common property is not allowed because it creates a liability for the RLPOA.

Raintree could contract to offer swim lessons in the future. However, between Swim Team practice and then swim lessons, the pool would be tied up until much later each day, making open swim begin at noon instead of 10:30 each day. Because of this, and that there are so many other options for swim lessons in the area, Raintree has chosen not to offer swim lessons at the pool at this time.



Raintree Pool Info: Reasons for the 15-Minute Swim Break

The last 15 minutes of each hour at the Raintree Pool have been deemed a Swim Break—which is for SAFETY REASONS. This is a time for the pool to be emptied so lifeguards can view a clear pool, take a break from their

duties, hydrate and rotate positions. During this time only adults, 18 years and older, may be in the pool, and the pool manager assumes the duties of lifeguard during that time.

Those under 18 years old may sit around the perimeter of the pool only.

Although this may be inconvenient for those at the pool, it is necessary for the safety of all residents and staff.

Leaving Gate Open at Boat Ramp

is a Violation!!

VII. MISCELLANEOUS OPERATING RULES:



22.Boat Ramp Gate: Each resident must close and lock gate after each use to load or unload a boat onto Raintree Lake, provided there is not another resident with current sticker waiting to use the ramp. Failure to close and lock the boat ramp gate is a violation.

VERIFICATION PROCESS FOR A BOAT THAT HAS NEVER BEEN ON RAINTREE LAKE:



Resident must provide title, registration or bill of sale to verify ownership of watercraft. If you have not taken a safety test, this will need to be done in the office. If you have never watched our Raintree Water Patrol

video (new residents) then this must also be done. It takes about 15 minutes for video and 30 minutes for the test.

FOR MOTORIZED: Please have your insurance carrier provide us a policy Declaration sheet showing at least \$100,000 minimum liability insurance with Raintree Lake Property Owners Association and the address of 825 SW Raintree Drive, Lee's Summit, MO 64082 listed as an additional interested party. This allows the insurance |carrier to notify the Raintree Lake office when policies are updated or cancelled.

After these items have been submitted to the RLPOA office we will create an application for stickers and a verification form for the Water Patrol to inspect your watercraft. Please allow 5 business days before setting up an appointment with the Water Patrol to have your boat verified. (Water Patrol # 816-520-3893 or 816-537-7576.)

FOR NON-MOTORIZED: Please have your insurance carrier provide us a copy of your Home Owners Insurance policy showing the policy number and the coverage dates.

PLEASE NOTE: Personal water craft do not need to be verified. Non-motorized boats i.e.: canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, paddle boats and non-towable floating device also do not need to be verified. **Motor boats, pontoons, sail boats and any vessel with a trolling motor would need to be verified.**

Once the Water Patrol has verified your watercraft, Water Patrol will turn your paperwork into the office and you will be able to come in and get your stickers. Motorized stickers are \$50.00 and non-motorized are \$15.00. We accept cash or check in the office.


Help us help you by planning ahead! This process can take time for the office to process paperwork during the busy months of summer. Your patience is greatly appreciated!! Thank you!

PREVENT ZEBRA MUSSELS!

Please do not take your boat and trailer to ANY OTHER body of water and then bring it back to Raintree Lake without following the Zebra Mussel prevention regulations. Cleaning requires a power wash, including the trailer with heated water and a quarantine/drying period. Washing alone is not sufficient due to the residual water left in live wells, the bilge, ballast tanks, and other compartments. The only safe procedure is to have your watercraft sit out for the appropriate time to dry. The quarantine time for the months of June through September is 7 days.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) advises that 104° F water, typical of a normal car wash, is adequate to kill Zebra Mussels with a 20 minute exposure of the hot water, and 140° F is adequate to kill Zebra Mussels with a 10 second exposure. The Greenwood Car Wash at 1103 W. Main St. (next to Casey's) has a bay that has been retrofitted to produce 140° F water at the wash nozzle - the east bay (the bay closest to Casey's.) This Boat Wash bay is currently the only known 140° F power wash station available in our area for residents to use for watercraft washing. Please take the potential threat of zebra mussels seriously. If you have any questions, please contact the Raintree Office at 537-7576.



CRIME PREVENTION BEGINS WITH YOU

A vacant home, or one that appears to be vacant, is an appealing target to a burglar. This is true during the day when everyone is at work, school or on vacation. Burglars look for "targets of opportunity" - a weekend away from home, a business trip or a dream vacation to Hawaii. There are many things you can do to avoid becoming one of their victims.

- Have a trusted person house sit.
- Double check that second floor and basement windows are locked. These areas are often forgotten. Use secondary locks which
 can be purchased at any hardware store.
- Make sure that exterior areas will not give your absence away. Ask a trusted neighbor or friend to pick up newspapers, mail, packages or any other kinds of advertisements left on your porch. Otherwise put a hold on your mail and newspapers.
- Leaving a vehicle in the driveway? Be sure that it is locked and that valuables are removed. Remove the garage door opener.
- Arrange to have the lawn mowed or the snow cleaned off the driveway. This will give the appearance that you are home.
- Secure or put ladders in the garage.
- Have interior lights on a timer. One timer can be programmed to go on and off several times during the evening. Several timers
 performing the same function can give a very "lived-in" appearance. Include radios and TV's adding an extra element to this
 appearance.
- Set your garage door openers to vacation mode.
- Keep a list of valuables in a safe place, not in your home or on a home computer. You will be glad to have this list in case of a burglary or fire.
- Ask that trusted neighbor or friend to check your home on a regular basis. Leave a number where you can be reached.
- If you have an alarm, contact your security company and verify contact names and numbers. Advise them when you are leaving
 and returning. Pass along information about people housesitting or checking your home. Set up separate codes for these
 individuals.
- Contact the Lee's Summit Police at 969-1770 and ask for a House Watch. Be prepared to answer several question regarding your time away. Officers will check on your home as workload permits. This is a **free** service.
- If you still have a home phone, lower the volume and don't leave a message saying you are out of town.
- Adjust blinds to make the home appear occupied.
- Don't hide keys under doormats, flowerpots or other well known hiding spots.
- Don't tell salespersons, cashiers or repair persons about your vacation.
- Don't post on social media your location or pictures until you return.

SOLICITORS AND PEDDLERS:

It's that time of year when you get that knock on the door from someone trying to sell you a gallon of miracle cleaner or magazines, among other items. If you get that knock on your door and you decide to answer it, speak through your door or keep your storm door locked as you are speaking to these individuals. Look for a badge showing that they have been approved by the police department. If they can't show you a badge, call the police. If you say that you are not interested and they will not leave you alone or attempt to block your door, call the police. Many of these peddlers are from out of town and state and some have warrants. An officer will drive through the neighborhood looking for the individual so provide the dispatcher with as much identifying information as you can.

Students attempting to sell a good or service as a fundraising activity for school or non-profit organization are exempt. A local Lee's Summit business is usually exempt also.

If in doubt or you are suspicious of an individuals intention, call 911.
