


Smokin' on the Point BBQ Competition




ADDITIONAL PARKING NEAR CREEKSIDE

Until then, park in the grass and not on the street. No overnight parking allowed.

RAINTREE LAKE SLALOM COURSE



The Slalom course on Raintree lake is maintained by the Raintree Ski Club. To date the club has spent over \$1,203, along with 52 man hours for repairs, involving up to 9 skiers and 3 boats. Evidence has been found of anchor dragging along the mainline resulting in broken diamond & movement of the entire course. Also, evidence has been found of propeller damaging due to the slicing of the mainline & grooves found in the PVC at the 5/2 arm. Also, the entire course had been picked up and dragged (west end southward) and then moved to the east like a backward "J" resulting in loss of Pregate & gate pvc arm and breakage of the 1/6 pvc arm and loss of both east anchors.

Please respect the slalom course and those who use/maintain it by following the rules regarding the course:

From the Raintree Rules and Regulations:

DEFINITIONS: 1. Slalom Course: A set of buoys providing a boat path and a zigzag ski path. 2. Buttonhook Turn: A tight radius turn for exiting and entering a slalom course.

RULES: 1. Only one (1) watercraft may use the slalom course at any given time. A watercraft shall wait to use the course until the course is clear. The course is considered clear when the watercraft and participant have left the course and buttonhook turning area. A watercraft may make multiple "passes" through the course. 2. Buttonhook turns are allowed for entering and exiting the slalom course. 3. Personal watercraft may not use the slalom course when participants are present. Water participants have priority. 4. Vandalism is prohibited. 5. Pontoon boats are too wide to pass through the center boat path buoys and are prohibited from driving through the center boat path buoys. 6. No vessel shall be anchored within 75 feet of the extreme boundaries of the ski course and shall never be positioned, either anchored or drifting, in a way that would interfere with normal navigable lake traffic or authorized ski course activity.

COURTESY RULES: 1. Boats waiting to use the course should wait a safe distance from the course and maintain a no-wake condition. 2. When boats are waiting to use the course, the boat on the course should yield the course after the current participant is finished. 3. Smooth water is a skier's dream. Please respect this and avoid large wakes in the course area. Idle speed is best; full speed is second best; half speed is terrible for wakes.



SOME POOL RULE REMINDERS:

Rule #3: No smoking, vaping, alcoholic beverages or drugs of any kind shall be allowed in the pool area.

Rule #16: Appropriate swim attire required. Prohibited attire includes but not limited to string or thong bikinis, jean shorts, basketball shorts, bras, tank tops, swim wear that becomes see through when wet or other attire determined to be inappropriate by Pool and/or RLPOA management.

Current Pool Instructions

The Jackson County Health Department may be making changes to the pool restrictions in the coming days. The only way to get the full and correct information, as soon as it is known, is to **sign up for the Raintree e-News at www.rlpoa.com**.

HERE'S SOME HELPFUL INFO FOR YOU TO KEEP IN MIND:

Dues must be current (balance less than \$136.26) and Resident ID cards are required for all family members, 3 years and older. Guests are not allowed at this time, however, grandparents that are residents can bring grandchildren—just make sure they are listed on Raintree card by checking with the office.

All 6' social distancing rules will apply with the exception of chairs (families can pull them together.) Social distancing is a MUST and parents/grandparents HAVE to be the responsible party for keeping children <u>social distancing in the pool and on the deck.</u> Lifeguards are only there to save life, not enforce distancing rules.

A safety break every hour still applies. This is for the staff to hydrate and rotate positions keeping them alert and you safe. There will be no temperature checks coming in—we are really putting that burden on the parents to know if a child (or themselves) should be at the pool. Please do not bring anyone that has been sick until 48 hours after they feel better. Obviously Covid-19 exposure is to quarantine for 14 days.

Maximum occupancy remains at 125 people.

You can sign up, for a 2-hour block of time, individually or as a family from the Raintree website (www.rlpoa.com). We will no longer limit it to two times per week. Walk-ins are not available—we do not want lines forming unless you have registered. Remember, 6' is required. We are also giving staff 30 minutes between blocks to sanitize chairs, handrails and bathrooms.

You must reserve for the correct number of people. For example, if four people of your family are coming to the pool, make the reservation for 4. If you list it as 1, then only 1 person will be allowed in the pool. If children are old enough to be at the pool by themselves, they can sign up individually.

You can go back in and review / edit / delete your reservation if necessary.

Adult swim is a reserved time block.


Babysitter passes can still be purchased. You would need to visit the office to fill out the paperwork.

The drinking fountain will not be connected, so please bring a container to fill if you want water from the bathroom. Concession will also be open, but will not be available to fill bottles due to sanitation concerns.

We are currently not booking for parties at the pool. Again, guests are not allowed and will be turned away. If all are residents that will be attending, then each family can reserve that time separately.

Residents are no longer allowed to eat at the pools edge.

INVASIVE SPECIES MANAGEMENT: ASIAN LONG-HORNED BEETLE SURVEY

What's black with white spots and long, curved antennae?

"The Asian longhorned beetle!" said MDC Forest Entomologist Robbie Doerhoff.

MDC is asking Missourians who own swimming pools to keep an eye out for this invasive forest pest in July and August. Why swimming pools?

"They're basically giant insect collectors, trapping anything that falls in," Doerhoff

The adult beetles are cool-looking insects, but their larvae tunnel under the bark and into the heartwood of native trees, eventually killing them. The Asian longhorned beetle is currently devastating trees in parts of Massachusetts, New York, and Ohio.

"The goal is to keep them out of Missouri, but if they are here, we want to know about it," Doerhoff said.

"While this pest can be stopped, thousands or even hundreds of thousands of trees may be cut down in the process," Doerhoff said. "Finding an Asian longhorned beetle infestation early means fewer trees will be removed. In an urban area, this is especially important because trees benefit communities in many ways, from storm water mitigation to savings on home energy costs."

Asian longhorned beetle infestations in other states have been the result of the beetle's larvae hitching a ride in the wood packaging material used to secure heavy freight during shipping from Asia. It's also a pest that can hitchhike in firewood, allowing this tree-killer to move long distances during a weekend camping trip.

"Our Asian longhorned beetle pool survey is a total citizen-science effort. Throughout the months of July and August, we're asking people with pools to check their filters and email us photos of large beetles they find," Doerhoff said.

ASIAN LONGHORNED BEETLES AT A GLANCE

- Larvae kill native trees, including maple, elm, and buckeye
- No known populations in Missouri
- Early detection will help save trees
- Check your home pool filter and send photos of large beetles to forest.health@mdc.mo.gov(link sends e-mail)

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Two long black-and white antennae
- Shiny black body with white spots
- Six legs
- 1–1½ inch-long body

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


