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### New Raintree Rule Regarding Outdoor Storage

At the October Board of Director's meeting the Board approved a new rule concerning outdoor storage:

Outdoor storage shall mean the keeping in an unroofed, open area of any goods, junk, material, merchandise for more than 48 hours. All lots shall be kept free of abandoned, improperly stored items or clutter.

abandoned, improperly stored items or clutter. Improperly stored items, clutter or abandoned items include, but are not limited to, ladders, coolers, building supplies/materials, auto parts, gas cans, car ramps, wagons/carts, lawn mowers, garden equipment/tools, bikes/toys, or other items that would cause unsightly appearance or dangerous conditions that would adversely affect the property and adjoining properties. Outdoor furniture must be placed on a porch, deck, courtyard, or patio unless integrated into the overall landscape design and within a defined landscape bed, fire pit area, as in the case of a garden bench, etc. No indoor furniture is allowed to remain outdoors.

REMINDER: Beginning November 1st, boats and boat trailers, even if they have Raintree stickers on them, are no longer allowed on the driveways. Fines begin at \$500.00.



### Home Improvements May Need Approval!!!!

Before you start home maintenance, remember that exterior changes may need approval from the Architectural Review Board (ARB).

Since the start of Covid, the ARB has been unable to meet with residents in person. During this time, the ARB has been reviewing

applications every weekend. All applications turned in by Wednesday of a week, will typically be reviewed over the weekend. Please plan ahead when planning a project and get your approval early because after approval, you are allowed 6 months to begin the project.

Some of the items that have to be approved: Roof Replacement, Exterior Paint (repainting existing color or new color choice), Fences, Pools, Decks/Patios. This is to name a few. *Failure to receive prior approval will result in a \$200 fine.* ARB applications are available online at <u>www.rlpoa.com</u> or in the office. ## **AVOID VEHICLE BREAK-INS!**

Lee's Summit saw an increase in vehicle "break-ins" this summer. Video cameras are capturing criminals walking through neighborhoods and trying to open vehicle doors. Here are a few reminders to help you not be a victim:

- Put your vehicle in the garage and then close the garage door. If your car doesn't fit take an afternoon to clean up the garage and make room for your vehicle.
- Park your vehicles in the driveway. You can also protect yourself from a hit- and- run accident
- Lock your vehicle doors and roll up the windows. The majority of the time the thief will move on if the car is locked. They don't want to bring attention to themselves by breaking a window unless...you leave personal items in open view. Purses, wallets, school backpacks, guns, sunglasses, GPS devices, phones and briefcases might be worth breaking a window for.
- Take your personal items inside or put them in the trunk.
- Take your garage door opener inside. If you don't lock the door to your home, it's like having a key to your home.
- **Do not leave your gun hidden in your vehicle.** Thieves could find it while rummaging through your vehicle. You wouldn't want your weapon used to commit another crime.
- It only takes a few extra seconds to lock everything up. It sure beats waiting for an officer to come out to file a report, and then going shopping to replace your items.

## Are you a Snow Bird?

### Enforcement will begin on unlicensed and expired tags of vehicles parked in the driveways, per Raintree Rules & Regulations

5. INOPERATIVE shall be defined as having any one (1) or more of the following conditions, which shall be deemed prima facie evidence that a vehicle is inoperable:

- A. Junk, wrecked, disabled or damaged beyond repair
- B. Placement of the vehicle or parts thereof upon jacks, blocks, chains or other supports;
- C. Having one (1) or more deflated or missing tires
- D. Absence of one or more parts of the vehicle necessary for the lawful operation of the vehicle upon the streets and highways;
- F. Allowed fines per differing vehicles are as referenced under this procedure.

3. ALL OTHER TYPES OF MOTOR AND INOPERABLE VEHICLES if violated as defined in Section E there shall be a fine of \$25 and thereafter each five (5) day period of disregard the fine shall be fifty (\$50) dollars.

### **ARTICLE VI: MEETINGS OF DIRECTORS**

**Section 6.** Reasonable Notice of Meetings. (a) Notice published in the Association's monthly newsletter, currently called RLPOA Shoreline, provided said newsletter is placed in the United States Mail, postage prepaid or if requested digitally, at least five (5) days before the meeting or event for which notice is given;

### **ARTICLE X: MEETINGS OF MEMBERS**

**Section 3. Notice of Meetings.** Written notice of each meeting of the Members shall be given by, or at the direction of, the secretary or person authorized to call the meeting, by mailing a copy of such notice, first class postage prepaid, or requested digitally at least 15 days before such meeting to each Member entitled to vote thereat, addressed to the Member's address last appearing on the books of the Association, or supplied by such Member to the Association for the purpose of notice. Such notice shall specify the place, day and hour of the meeting and, in the case of a special meeting, the purpose of the meeting.

## Dog Parks Available in Lee's Summit

Did you know there are dog parks on Ranson Road and Victoria Drive in Lee's Summit where you can play with your dog off the leash?

Here are the two locations: Dogwood Park—107-109 NW Victoria Dr Happy Tails Park—1251 SE Ranson Rd

REMINDER: The dry basin in Raintree is not a dog park. Lee's Summit has a leash law which applies to all pets. Animal Control can be called (816-969-1640) when an animal is seen off leash.



**Q:** What do our Raintree dues go toward? A: Maintaining the association's capital assets is the number one item the Raintree Board of Directors is tasked with. Looking at our beautiful community as a whole, we have over 350 acres of common area that includes walking trails, 10 ponds, monument entrances, 2 playgrounds and swimming pool. We have 2 buildings for resident use and a 235 acre recreational lake with a rental pontoon, boat docks, swim docks and courtesy docks.

**Q:** I see codes violations in our neighborhood that seem to never be addressed, but if I do anything wrong, I get a letter right away. Why do some issues persist? A: Our Codes Administrator documents all codes violations and sends out letters. If a resident does not comply, they will receive additional letters and fines will be assessed. Some residents are quick to comply, others are not. In some cases of non-compliance, the matter is eventually turned over to the City.

## DO YOU KNOW THE MISSOURI STATE FRUIT TREE??

In 2019, after lobbying and testifying by a group of St. Louis students, the PAWPAW was named Missouri's official state fruit tree. Pawpaw is increasingly popular as a native landscaping and fruit tree. If you want fruit, plant two unrelated trees so they can cross-pollinate.

The sweet fruit is eaten raw or baked. There are many recipes for it. It has even been used for flavoring beer! The wood has no commercial use, but the inner bark was woven into a fiber cloth by Native Americans, and pioneers used it for stringing fish. Pawpaw extract is being studied as a possible cancer-fighting drug. There are many historical medicinal uses.

The Pawpaw tree grows in colonies to 30 feet tall, in dense shade on moist lower slopes, ravines, valleys, along streams, and at the base of wooded bluffs. The tree flowers March through May. The dark reddish-purple flowers contain both male and female parts in the same flower and are approximately 1-inch across. The leaves turn yellow in autumn and remain on the tree late into the season. Pawpaw is a member of a tropical family and has no close relatives in Missouri.



The Pawpaw tree fruits in September and October. The fruit is cylindrical, 3-5 inches long, is green at first and yellow when ripe. The fruit has a sweet banana/pineapple flavor, a creamy texture, and a green-skinned, multi-seeded fruit structure.

The fruit is relished by numerous bird species and by squirrels, opossums, and raccoons. Often these creatures find the pawpaws before human pawpaw hunters do, which is one reason many people are planting their own pawpaw trees!





The lovely black-and-white striped zebra swallowtail butterfly requires pawpaw leaves as its larval food plant, so if you want to see zebra swallowtails, go where the pawpaw trees live. Zebra swallowtails cannot live on any other plant: pawpaw foliage is where they develop as caterpillars, and that's where the females must lay eggs.

Native trees play an important and irreplaceable role in our Missouri ecosystems, feeding insects and larger animals that are adapted to eating them. When you plant native trees and other plants, you are strengthening the fabric of nature and helping to offset habitat loss, fragmentation, and degradation.
