To all Raintree Boaters,



We are currently in the hiring process of a structural engineer that specializes in docks and waterfront communities. This study will give us a current assessment of the docks and lake activity. There are a lot of accusations being broadcasted but we do not have all the facts. We are in need of a professional opinion that can be implemented on our lake.

Until the process can be completed we need to work together as a community. The Board of Directors is asking all vessels to be kind, courteous, and respectful of other boaters on the water. Until further notice; all wakes surf vessels actively pulling a surfer are asked to use the north arm of our lake. If a surf vessel needs to travel on the south arm the vessel needs to be traveling at idle speed or on full plane. No plowing in the south arm. This update is until further notice from the Board of Directors. A map has been attached below. The area in yellow is where wake surfing boats are allowed to plow.

All other vessels are allowed to return to towing passengers where they please. Just a reminder to abide by all current lake regulations and be respectful of other boaters using the water. This is a multifaceted problem and the board is making decisions for the benefit of the community as a whole. We will continue to move forward improving the association and thank all residents for being understanding while we wait for the study to be completed.

What Causes Aquatic Weed Growth?

The primary factors that influence the growth of aquatic weeds are water depth, bottom type, nutrient level and water clarity. These factors vary from one body of water to the next and are influenced by the surrounding watershed.

As lakes age they fill with sediment rich in nutrients such as nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium. Waters become shallower and more fertile favoring weed growth.

Weather influences weed growth. Runoff from heavy rain carries nutrients into the water. Drought may lower water levels creating shallow areas suitable for heavy weed growth. Sunlight contributes to heavy weed growth particularly in shallow, clear waters.

Human activities contribute to weed growth. Clearing of land for development and farming cause soil erosion leading to increased sedimentation. Discharges from sewage treatment plants, livestock feedlots, and leady septic systems provide additional sources of nutrients. Hard surfaces such as roads promote runoff rather than absorption and natural filtration.

For these reasons waters that would not support heavy weed growth under natural conditions may support heavy weed growth as a result of human activities.

Small Efforts Make A Big Difference in Recreational Boating Safety:

The Water Patrol's overall Goal is to promote an enjoyable lake environment and ensure water safety. Raintree Lake residents have been key in making this goal a reality. Here are some reminders on how, as a boating community, we can ensure we have another safe boating season in 2021.

<u>Just Wear It.</u> Life jackets are the lifeblood of boating safety. Children 7 and under have to wear a personal floatation device while on board a boat at Raintree Lake. Getting an infant to wear them can be difficult, but it is a must.

<u>Operator inattention is the number one cause of boat accidents.</u> The captain of the boat should make sure all occupants are seated while the vessel is moving. At no time should a passenger be allowed to stand on the swim deck or bow while the boat is moving. This also includes launching from a slip or landing at a dock.

Boaters while tubing are to stay 50 feet away from other boats or docks. Make sure before you dock, pull in the tube and have all passengers on board safely. Also do not launch with a tube out from a dock. Wait till at least 50 feet away from docks to deploy your tube.

<u>Swimmers are not to swim more than 50 feet from shore.</u> If in a designated swim area, same applies, do not swim out past the swim buoys. This is a \$50 fine and a 30-day suspension from use of all amenities.

Lake Reminders During Storm Season

- Boaters—During stormy weather, be sure to check on your boat to make sure your cover is secure, your bilge is working, etc.
- Also both boaters and swimmers need to be aware of debris floating in the lake that could become a hazard.
- Be aware that after a storm event, the lake e-coli levels will be high—so swim at your own risk.
- Remember, if you see lightning or hear thunder, head home! Don't be the highest point on the lake in a storm!



So, each household has the possibility of having 20 guest credits for use at the beginning of the season. These credits are loaded electronically in the office and reduced electronically by pool employees when a member of your household brings in guests.

Q:What if I run out of Guest Credits?

A:Additional Guest Credits can be purchased in the Raintree Office (NOT AT THE POOL) for \$2.00 each, in lots of 10. So for \$20.00 you receive 10 Guest Credits. Any Guest Credits that are purchased and not used will be brought forward to the next year.

Remember that you must stay with, and are responsible for, any guest you bring to the pool.
