#### What Exactly Is Storm Water Runoff? By Jason Luce, Lake Management Scientist

Have you ever wondered what happens to a single drop of water when it rains? Depending upon where you live, that drop of water may land on the ground and seep into the soil or it may land on a leaf and evaporate back into the atmosphere. But, if you live in a developed area such as a city or housing community, the fate of that droplet of water may be a rooftop, sidewalk or road— and eventually end up in a storm water lake or pond.

As development increases, so does storm water runoff. Storm water runoff is the portion of rainfall or snowmelt that "runs off" the landscape instead of seeping into the ground. When managed incorrectly, storm water runoff can become a major problem. Why is storm water runoff a concern? As storm water runs across impervious surfaces, like sidewalks and parking lots, it accumulates and transports nutrients, pollutants, debris and even harmful chemicals. If the runoff is not properly captured in a storm water basin, this polluted water can make its way directly into a nearby stream, lake or wetland.

Storm water management facilities are designed to stop storm water from directly entering natural waterways and also to decrease the speed in which water enters a natural landscape from a developed one. Storm water management facilities also allow nutrients, pollutants and sediment to be captured before entering into a freshwater ecosystem. Problems arise when facilities are left unmanaged or allowed to "grow in" with unwanted vegetation or filled in with too much sediment. Problems due to unmanaged storm water runoff include costly erosion, property damage and flooding.

What can we do to help manage storm water runoff effectively? There are likely storm water management facilities and infrastructure already present in your community. Left untouched, these facilities can develop deficiencies and even become non-compliant with local, state or federal regulations. Having an annual management plan in place with a lake or pond management professional is the best way to make certain your facilities are functioning properly.

Routine monthly inspections focused on managing vegetative growth, sediment and debris build-up and erosion are strongly encouraged. Monthly inspections should also focus on the structural aspects such as inflow pipes, outflow structures and dams. This can help reveal small problems, such as new erosion or minor structural damage, before they become a large and costly endeavor for land owners or HOAs. Additionally, proactive management strategies such as installation of an aeration system or maintenance of a beneficial vegetative buffer are recommended to help promote good water quality and keep your storm water lake or pond looking beautiful.

#### RAINTREE POND COMMITTEE





Raintree has 10 siltation ponds that, in addition to being functional for the lake, provide enjoyment for Raintree fishermen, and trails around the ponds provide a great venue for walking enthusiasts or an evening stroll.

The Pond Committee was formed in 2015 with the mission of improving the appearance, serviceability, and use of the ponds. The HOA has a pond maintenance contract for control of algae and aquatic weed growth. Our Committee involvement includes monitoring for bank erosion, improving appearance of the ponds, and removing trash from the ponds. In addition, we are promoting completion of walking trails in the Estates.

Membership on the Committee is not necessary to help with our mission, but more members are always welcome. We would especially appreciate representation of residences from the ponds; however, this is certainly not a requirement. If you would like to join us, we meet monthly on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday at 10:00 a.m. in the clubhouse. You can contact our Committee Chairman, Roger Sense, at 816-377-3186.

#### **Leaving Gate Open at Boat Ramp is a Violation!!**

**VII. MISCELLANEOUS OPERATING RULES:** 

22. Boat Ramp Gate: Each resident must close and lock gate after each use to load or unload a boat onto Raintree Lake, provided there is not another resident with current sticker waiting to use the ramp. Failure to close and lock the boat ramp gate is a violation. Approved 7-10-18

The gate at the boat ramp is intended to serve as a reminder that every boater at Raintree is responsible for the health of our lake.

There are two reasons for the gate: trespassers and invasive species control. Trespassing boaters have been relatively minimal, but they cause a fair amount of concern. A locked gate is expected to send a very clear message to would-be trespassers.

The second reason, invasive species control, is a much more significant challenge that could affect all residents. The invasive species of most concern to the Lake Committee and the Board is zebra mussels. Zebra mussels can cause significant damage to boats and structures in the lake as well as injury to swimmers—all of which has the potential to reduce property values in our community.

Zebra mussels reproduce at incredible rates. A single female zebra mussel can reproduce a million eggs each year. Zebra mussels are not visible to the naked eye in their larvae stage. Zebra mussels have been identified a number of locations in Missouri and Kansas. They have not been found in Raintree Lake at this point.

Please do not be offended or defensive if this is asked of you. Raintree residents have the right to enjoy the lake and other amenities, but since this is private property, others who are non-residents, do not have that same right and will be asked to leave, unless they are guests of a Raintree resident. Residents need only show their I.D. card and continue enjoying the lake.

Don't have a Raintree I.D. card? Stop by the office and get one—the first one is free. Replacements cost \$5.00.

#### **Pool Guest Credit Q & A:**

Q:How do I get Guest Credits to use at the pool?

So, each household has the possibility of having 20 guest credits for use at the beginning of the season. These credits are loaded electronically in the office and reduced electronically by pool employees when a member of your household brings in guests.

#### PREVENT ZEBRA MUSSELS!

Please do not take your boat and trailer to **ANY OTHER** body of water and then bring it back to Raintree Lake without following the Zebra Mussel prevention regulations. Cleaning requires a power wash, including the trailer with heated water and a



quarantine/drying period. Washing alone is not sufficient due to the residual water left in live wells, the bilge, ballast tanks, and other compartments. The only safe procedure is to have your watercraft sit out for the appropriate time to dry. The quarantine time for the months of June through September is 7 days.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) advises that 104° F water, typical of a normal car wash, is adequate to kill Zebra Mussels with a 20 minute exposure of the hot water, and 140° F is adequate to kill Zebra Mussels with a 10 second exposure. The Greenwood Car Wash at 1103 W. Main St. (next to Casey's) has a bay that has been retrofitted to produce 140° F water at the wash nozzle - the east bay (the bay closest to Casey's.) This Boat Wash bay is currently the only known 140° F power wash station available in our area for residents to use for watercraft washing. Please take the potential threat of zebra mussels seriously! If you have any questions, please contact the Raintree Office at 537-7576.

# Fireworks can be a source of fear for many animals but it doesn't

Fireworks can be a source of fear for many animals but it doesn't have to be that way. Don't ignore the problem – follow our top tips to make fireworks celebrations less frightening for your pets.

#### Keeping pets secure

Give your cat or dog somewhere to hide that they have access to at all times, e.g. under furniture or in a quiet corner. Walk dogs
during daylight
hours. Keep dogs and
cats indoors when
fireworks are likely to
be set off.

At
nightfall close
windows and curtains.
Put on music to mask
the sound of
fireworks.

Make
sure your pet can't
escape if there's a
sudden noise. Have
them microchipped
just in case.

Never
punish your pets
when they are scared
as this will only make
things worse in
the long run.

It's fine to comfort your pet if it helps them relax, or leave them alone unless you think they will harm themselves.

#### Just for dogs

Close any windows and black out a 'doggy play area' so that your dog can't see the flashing lights.

Before fireworks begin, move your dog to the doggy play area with all their favourite toys.

Ignore the fireworks yourself.
Play with a toy to see if your dog
wants to join in, but don't force them.

Ask your vet for advice about pheromone diffusers and being referred to a clinical animal behaviourist for help.

- Bottle Rockets
- Roman Candles

- Parachute with nighttime effects



 Missiles with fins or rudders for aerodynamic flight

For a complete list of prohibited fireworks, review your Fireworks Permit.

No person, firm, or corporation shall construct a retail display for, sell, or offer for sale, explosives, explosive materials, or fireworks within the corporate city limits, except as allowed for permitted blasting operations and commercial fireworks displays, and except the retail display and sale of certain Division 1.4G fireworks shall be permitted within the corporate city limits by nonprofit, religious or community service organizations from June 23 through midnight on July 4.

This notice must be posted in a conspicuous place in approved vendors tent, shop or store as indicated by the City of Lee's Summit where business is conducting fireworks sales in accordance with the city ordinances.









### Fourth of July Fireworks

The first fireworks were used as early as 200 BC. The tradition of setting off fireworks on the 4 of July began in Philadelphia on July 4, 1777, during the first organized celebration of Independence Day. Ship's cannon fired a 13-gun salute in honor of the 13 colonies. The Pennsylvania Evening Post reported: "at night there was a grand exhibition of fireworks (which began and concluded with thirteen rockets) on the Commons, and the city was beautifully illuminated. "That same night, the Sons of Liberty set off fireworks over Boston Common.

#### Fourth of July Background

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the thirteen colonies from Great Britain in 1776 actually occurred on July 2, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain's rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it two days later on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail:

The second day of July 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.

Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.

Historians have long disputed whether members of Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the Declaration was signed nearly a month after its adoption, on August 2, 1776, and not on July 4 as is commonly believed.

By a remarkable coincidence, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, the only two signatories of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as presidents of the United States, both died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration, Jefferson even mentioning the fact. Although not a signatory of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as president, also died on July 4, 1831, making him the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. The only U.S. president to have been born on Independence Day was Calvin Coolidge, who was born on July 4, 1872.

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
