

Are you a "Snow Bird"?



Home Improvements May Need Approval!!!!

Please remember that exterior changes may need approval from the Architectural Review Board (ARB). To accommodate residents' needs, the ARB meets on Monday's of each month. Applications to be considered need to be turned into the office the Thursday prior to the meeting.

Please plan ahead when planning a project and get your approval early because you then are allowed 6 months to begin the project. ARB applications can be found on our website at www.rlpoa.com under "For Residents" > Forms > Architectural Review Forms. Please select the application required for your project. Some applications do require "plot plans," so contact the office if you do not have one available and we can check to see if we have one on file. ALL APPLICATIONS HAVE TO BE TURNED INTO THE RAINTREE OFFICE—PLEASE DO NOT EMAIL THEM TO THE ARB DIRECTLY.

Here are some of the items that have to be approved: Roof Replacement, Exterior Paint (repainting existing color or new color choice), Fences, Pools, Decks/Patios, Retaining Walls, Play Equipment, and Driveways. This is to name a few.

Failure to receive prior approval will result in a \$200 fine. If you have any questions, contact the office at 816-537-7576.

MAKE YOUR OWN CHRISTMAS MEMORY AND HELP OTHERS!!!


2021 continues to present its challenges. Unfortunately, Santa is unable to make his normal appearance to visit all the Raintree kiddos in person at the Clubhouse this year.



News from the Garden Club

The Garden club was able to have both the Spring and Fall Fundraisers this year after not having them in 2020 due to the pandemic. The Spring Fundraiser was very successful, but the Fall Fundraiser was not and maybe it was due to the



weather. The autumn months of September and October were more like summer months with high temperatures and hardly any rainfall. With no money coming into the Garden Club treasury in 2020 and a smaller amount this year, we will not be able to do all the necessary improvements needed at the Duck Pond Flower Garden. We will only be able to redo the front edging along the path, but not the back edging. We will also be able to do the Christmas Lights. This will cost thousands of dollars and will nearly deplete our treasury funds, but the club has decided to go ahead with both of these projects. Next year we will need to have two successful fundraisers to keep doing improvements for the Duck Pond Garden. This garden provides a beautiful entrance to our community and has won many Lee's Summit landscaping awards. Many wedding photos have been taken there. We are asking Raintree residents to fully support both of our fundraisers next year.

The club was founded in 2003. On average there are between 25 - 30 members each year. Our goal has been and will continue to be to beautify the main entrance of our community. Over the years the majority of the garden club funds have been spent for that purpose. Rarely has any money been spent on the club itself. Besides making improvements (statute, waterfall, walking path, flowers and trees, Christmas Lights) at the Duck Pond Garden, the Garden Club also purchased the flower pots on the Regatta Islands as well as purchasing garden gloves yearly to be placed in New Resident Welcome Baskets.

Again, the club pays for all the improvements to the Duck Pond Flower Bed, but the home association pays for maintenance. This year there has been a big problem with the waterfall.

If you have not noticed, it has been turned off for weeks. It has been badly damaged for the second time by children or adults walking /climbing on the unsecured rocks and puncturing the pool-liner equivalent beneath. Unfortunately, this will again cost \$\$\$ from the HOA to repair. The rocks are not secured, it is dangerous to climb, and causes expensive repairs due to the damage. THE WATERFALL IS NOT A CLIMBING WALL! PLEASE SO DO NOT CLIMB IN THE WATERFALL! We want the Duck Pond Garden with the waterfall to be enjoyed by all Raintree Lake residents.







- Q: What do our Raintree dues go toward? A: Maintaining the association's capital assets is the number one item the Raintree Board of Directors is tasked with. Looking at our beautiful community as a whole, we have over 350 acres of common area that includes walking trails, 10 ponds, monument entrances, 2 playgrounds and swimming pool. We have 2 buildings for resident use and a 235 acre recreational lake with a rental pontoon, boat docks, swim docks and courtesy docks.
- Q: I see codes violations in our neighborhood that seem to never be addressed, but if I do anything wrong, I get a letter right away. Why do some issues persist? A: Our Codes Administrator documents all codes violations and sends out letters. If a resident does not comply, they will receive additional letters and fines will be assessed. Some residents are quick to comply, others are not. In some cases of non-compliance, the matter is eventually turned over to the City.


