4. Appeals Process for Boat Length:

Any boat length appeal will be directed to the office to begin this process.

- The homeowner will contact the office to set up an appointment to re-measure the boat in question a second time at the original location.
- At the appointment, the boat involved will be re-measured by at least two of the three authorized Raintree Boat Measuring personnel. One of the authorized personnel will include the original person that measured the boat. At least one Raintree Board member will also be present during the second measurement.
- The second measurement result will be shared with the homeowner and office staff. If the boat meets our Raintree boat length requirements, the homeowner will be allowed to purchase boat stickers for that boat. If the boat fails the Raintree boat length measurement guidelines a second time, the only path for appeal is directly to the Raintree Board of Directors.



Leaving Gate Open at Boat Ramp is a Violation!!



VII. MISCELLANEOUS OPERATING RULES:

22. Boat Ramp Gate: Each resident must close and lock gate after each use to load or unload a boat onto Raintree Lake, provided there is not another resident with current sticker waiting to use the ramp. Failure to close and lock the boat ramp gate is a violation. Approved 7-10-18

The gate at the boat ramp is intended to serve as a reminder that every boater at Raintree is responsible for the health of our lake.

There are two reasons for the gate: trespassers and invasive species control. Trespassing boaters have been relatively minimal, but they cause a fair amount of concern. A locked gate is expected to send a very clear message to would-be trespassers.

The second reason, invasive species control, is a much more significant challenge <u>that could affect all residents.</u> The invasive species of most concern to the Lake Committee and the Board is zebra mussels. Zebra mussels can cause significant damage to boats and structures in the lake as well as injury to swimmers—all of which has the potential to reduce property values in our community.

Zebra mussels reproduce at incredible rates. A single female zebra mussel can reproduce a million eggs each year. Zebra mussels are not visible to the naked eye in their larvae stage. Zebra mussels have been identified in a number of locations in Missouri and Kansas. They have not been found in Raintree Lake at this point.

Key points to remember: CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY, DISPOSE. Cleaning with water heated to 140°F instantly kills mussels. The Boat/ Truck wash next to Casey's in Greenwood is set to a minimum of 140°F and is recommended for use by all boats that have been in infested waters prior to re-entry into Raintree Lake. In addition to cleaning and drying the boat, special attention should be paid to trailers, bilges, live wells, ballast tanks, bait buckets, fat sacks, life jackets, tubes, wakeboards, skis, ropes, wet suits and any other gear that has been in infested waters to ensure that they are thoroughly cleaned and dried as well.

Current Pool Information

- The pool WILL open with regular operating hours WOO HOO!!!
- Pool guests...Minor residents may have up to 2 guests per lot per day when unaccompanied by lot owner/lessee.
- We are putting the burden on parents to know if a child (or themselves) should be at the pool. Please do not bring anyone that has been sick until 48 hours after they feel better.
- Residents are no longer allowed to eat at the pool's edge.
- Maximum occupancy is 235 people.

Current Swim Dock Information

Swim Docks will remain limited to residents only or lot owner/lessee with up to 2 guests per lot. There will be a maximum limit of 8 people allowed within the dock and swim area. Owner or Lessee **MUST** be present with guests at **ALL** times.



SOME POOL RULE REMINDERS:

Rule #3: No smoking, vaping, alcoholic beverages or drugs of any kind shall be allowed in the pool area.

Rule #16: Appropriate swim attire required. Prohibited attire includes but not limited to string or thong bikinis, jean shorts, basketball shorts, bras, tanktops, swim wear that becomes see through when wet or other attire determined to be inappropriate by Pool and/or RLPOA management.





Raintree Pool Info: Reasons for the <u>15-Minute</u> Swim Break

The last 15 minutes of each hour at the Raintree Pool have been deemed a Swim Break—which is for SAFETY REASONS. This is a time for the pool to be emptied so lifeguards can view a clear pool, take a break from their duties, hydrate and rotate positions. During this time only adults, 18 years and older, may be in the pool, and the pool manager assumes the duties of lifeguard during that time.

Those under 18 years old may sit around the perimeter of the pool only.

Although this may be inconvenient for those at the pool, it is necessary for the safety of all residents and staff.

Babysitter passes, Caregiver passes, and House Sitter Passes are available for \$50.00 in the Raintree Office for the 2023 Pool Season. A Raintree homeowner must come to the office to fill out the necessary paperwork before pass will be granted. The office accepts payment of cash or check.

Raintree I.D. Troubles?

Lose your Raintree ID? Dog tear it to shreds? Whatever shall you do? No need to fret, the Raintree Office can help!

To replace a LOST card, \$5.00 will get you a new one! The office *only* accepts cash or check!

To replace a ruined card, bring what is left and you will receive a replacement at no cost to you!



Pool Guest Credit Q & A:

Q: How do I get Guest Credits to use at the pool?

- A: Ten Guest Credits are given to each Raintree household each year These credits are loaded electronically in the office and reduced electronically by pool employees when a member of your household brings in guests.
- Q: What if I run out of Guest Credits?
- A: Additional Guest Credits can be purchased in the Raintree Office (NOT AT THE POOL) for \$5.00 each, in groups of 10. So for \$50.00 you will receive 10 Guest Credits. Any Guest Credits that are purchased and not used will be brought forward to the next year.

Remember that you must stay with, and are responsible for, any guest you bring to the pool.

Also, please remember that dues must be up-to-date in order to use the pool.

HELLO JUNE

Life in **JUNE** often includes gathering with friends and family for weddings, graduations and visits. There's a good reason **JUNE** is so popular for weddings. In addition to nearly perfect weather, the month of **JUNE** is considered auspicious for weddings because it's named after JUNO, the Roman Goddess of marriage, home, and family. *"It is JUNE, and the world smells of roses. RAINLAKE GARDEN CLUB BUTTERFLY GARDEN AT RAINTREE VIEW

If you drive by the Raintree View area on SW Raintree Pkwy you'll see a 15 foot square garden and a sign that states **"RAINTREE LAKE GARDEN CLUB BUTTERFLY GARDEN-WORK IN PROGRESS."** The new garden is located adjacent to a pre-existing Rain Garden. Before the work began on the Butterfly Garden all necessary approvals were received for the Board of Directors, the Raintree View and Common Ground Committees. Several garden club ladies have been busy preparing the garden with no-till cardboard sheet mulching, planting a variety of flowering native and cultivated plants with blooms to attract butterflies and other pollinators, and watering during the dry spells of this Spring. The tiny plants are developing more roots than above-ground growth in this early stage. Among the many expected blooms are several plants that are host plants for local Missouri butterflies, including three types of Mllkweed for Monarch butterflies, two types of Asters for the Pearl Crescent butterfly, and Hollyhock for Checkered Skipper and Painted Lady butterflies. Teri Gill is the chairperson for this project, and her helpers to date have been Margaret Legel, Mary Dawson, Blanche McWilliams, Kate Leppla, Cheryl Terry, Cindy White, and Machelle Seiler. A big thank you to all these ladies for adding another beautiful garden in the Raintree community. Also, garden club members will continue to maintain the Duck Pond Garden as well as planting flowers around the clubhouse flag pole this year. **DID YOU KNOW** - there are 17,500 butterfly species in the world, 750 species in the United States, and 200 different species in Missouri.

SPRING FUNDRAISER

Please remember that exterior changes may need approval from the Architectural Review Board (ARB). To accommodate residents' needs, the ARB meets on the 1st and 3rd Monday's of each month. Applications to be considered need to be turned into the office the Thursday prior to the meeting. <u>Please</u> plan to get your applications in early so you'll be able to start your project when the contractor is available. You only have 6 months from the date of approval to complete your project or you will

<u>have to resubmit</u>. ARB applications can be found on our website at www.rlpoa.com under "For Residents" > Forms > Architectural Review Forms. Please select the application required for your project. Some applications do require "plot plans," so contact the office if you do not have one available and we can check to see if we have one on file. <u>ALL APPLICATIONS HAVE</u> TO BE TURNED INTO THE RAINTREE OFFICE - PLEASE DO NOT EMAIL THEM TO THE ARB DIRECTLY.

Here are some of the items that have to be approved: Roof Replacement, Exterior Paint (repainting existing color or new color choice), Fences, Pools, Decks/Patios, Retaining Walls, Play Equipment, and Driveways. See the ARB guidelines on our website at www.rlpoa.com for additional information.

Failure to receive prior approval will result in a \$200 fine. If you have any questions, contact the office at 816-537-7576.



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












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

Raintree residents have the right to enjoy the lake and other amenities, but since this is private property, others who are non-residents, do not have that same right and will be asked to leave, unless they are guests of a Raintree resident. <u>Residents need only show their I.D. card and continue enjoying the lake.</u>
