

The following action was taken at the September 12, 2023, Board of Directors meeting:

Using rates from the consumer price index for all urban consumers from July of the preceding year to July of the current year the CPI increase would be 3.20%. The Board of Directors voted to increase the yearly assessment approximately 3.20% in 2024.

Current assessment for single family is \$629.40; the new amount will be \$649.56. This is an increase of \$20.16 per year.



Current assessment for Class B residents in Cobblestone, Windsong and Raintree Lake "attached" Villas is \$419.40; the new amount will be \$432.84. This is an increase of \$13.44 per year.



Current assessment for commercial property is \$560.16; the new amount will be \$578.04. This is an increase of \$17.88 per year.

We will continue billing every quarter. The next invoice will be mailed or emailed to you the first of January 2024.

OCTOBER GARDEN CLUB MEETING - OCTOBER 18TH @ 7:00 PM @ THE DPAC

HELLO OCTOBER

October is here! The leaves have turned from green to marvelous shades of red and gold, and some are beginning to fall. In **October** we all start getting in the holiday planning mode for the last holidays of the year - Halloween, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

OCTOBER QUOTES

OCTOBER GARDENING CHORES

* **TAKE CARE OF LEAVES** - Changing leaves look lovely when they are still on their trees, but when they die off they can damage your lawn and present a slip hazard for walkways, decks and driveways.

* PLANTING SPRING BULBS - Mid-October is a great time to begin planting bulbs that will flower in the spring .

* **MOVING PLANTS INDOORS** - This is the time of year when you want to move any tropical houseplants inside. Trim the plants, remove any weeds and fallen leaves from the soil, and give the plants a gentle spray with your hose to get rid of the insects.

- * PUT AWAY HOSES FOR THE SEASON UNLESS WATERING IS STILL NEEDED IN THE MIDST OF A DROUGHT.
- * CONTINUE TO MOW THE LAWN as long as the grass keeps growing, but with the mower blades at the highest level.
- * GOOD TIME TO RESEED PARTS OF YOUR YARD that have gotten thin and bare and apply herbicides to help control weeds.
- * DO A SURVEY OF YOUR GARDEN what worked, what didn't work and make a plan for possible changes for the upcoming year.

* **KEEP ON WEEDING** - This will prevent fewer weed seeds, which means fewer weeds next year. Be sure to pull everything out of your vegetable garden so there's no decaying plants left behind that could harbor pests and diseases.

* AND FINALLY, ENJOY THE CRISP AUTUMN DAYS OF OCTOBER AS YOU WORK IN YOUR GARDEN AND YARD!



Landfill Meeting Sept. 6, 2023 7:00pm Held at Creekmore Clubhouse.

In attendance were 8 elected officials from Raymore, Grandview, Cass County and Lee's Summit. Including Fox 4 news.

History: Grass root effort took Jefferson City by storm. The elected officials were taken by surprise. This should be a bi-partisan fight, but Missouri is starting to be Washington D.C.

Overview: Monheiser has increased their lobbyist from 17 to 20 recently. Creekmore's property values have currently **decreased by 20-30%.** Area landfills have life expectancy ranges left from 10 to 80 years. Property being purchased for landfill is currently zoned "rural residential". EPA states on their website "All landfills leak". Flares will burn continuously at the landfill. We will research air monitoring for baseline. And will impact 7,705 students that attend schools directly in the area. Only M-150 (concrete) will support the weight of the traffic. All other roads are asphalt.

When the governor vetoed the request for \$100,000 for DNR to perform a regional study, this was the correct measure. The State has a responsibility to study the whole state, not just regional. DNR is currently looking for funds within their waste division for a state wide study.

And all bills have to go back through the House, Rules Committee and Senate.

Strategy: HB909 will go back in session. They want everyone to Stay Engaged! Hold elected officials accountable. Use Freedom of Information Act! Bog down the system.

Resident civil engineer stated "that he works with developers, but this time it is personal for him". He stated that HOA's terrify developers. Wants us to create a coalition of HOA's. Create a baseline of environmental concerns, prior to development.

Other person wanted to pool funds to purchase the land. Allegedly, Monheiser has only purchased with options, does not actually own yet and has approached landowners on the north side of M-150 also.

Keep emails up! Texts, emails, phone calls. Hold elected officials accountable.

The Conservation Committee is working with the Missouri Department of Conservation to complete a fish shocking report to analyze the fish population in Raintree during 2023. Date to be determined. The Committee is continually deploying fish habitats in accordance with the Department of Conservation guidelines.

CURRENT FISHING GUIDELINES:

Fishing is permitted only by use of attended poles or rods with attached lines. Cast nets may be used for catching bait, but not game fish. All bluegill, green sunfish and bullheads more than 5 inches long, and other species of nongame fish more than 12 inches long, must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught by any of the methods listed above except pole and line. The daily limits for nongame fish apply to the large fish taken by pole and line.

Largemouth bass:12-15 inches - should be released unharmed and not kept in possession. Under 12 inches - limit five (5)

Over 15 inches - limit one (1) any angler may have only one fish over 15 inches in his/her possession unless participating in an approved event in which you may have up to three fish over 15 inches and all fish must be released upon the end of the event.

Bluegill: No limit or size restrictions

Crappie, white bass, and hybrid bass: No length limits, daily limit thirty (30) Channel catfish, flat head catfish: No length limits, daily limit ten (10)
