Board Approvals for June 11, 2024

- ♦ Approved Handicapped Golf Cart rules. (see below)

Driving on Common Ground with cars, motorcycles, *golf carts* or off-road vehicles are not allowed. *Only limited motorized travel is allowed on Common Ground areas for homeowners with disabilities* and/or mowing. Exceptions may be granted by the RLPOA General Manager.

Handicap Golf Cart Requirements:

- A. Office will require a copy of your State issued handicap placard, and a copy of your insurance on the golf cart.
- B. This does not allow the family to utilize unless Resident that requires the exception is in the golf cart.
- C. There is limited access for the specific request (example boat dock, fishing dock) made.
- D. Annual renewal required of permit and must be on golf cart by May 1 each year.



Procedures for Residents with WATERCRAFT "NEW" to Raintree Lake

If you have a, "New to Raintree" watercraft, please send us your title, registration or bill of sale, safety test and a copy of the declaration page of your Boat Insurance as soon as possible. The insurance declaration page needs to have RLPOA listed as an additional interested party with our address. (RLPOA, 825 SW Raintree Drive, Lee's Summit MO 64082) Make sure you watch the video online and then take the safety test. It is an open book test that you can find on the website along with the lake regulations and the video to find the answers. "New to Raintree" watercraft need to be inspected by the water patrol. The process can take up to 7 days due to the increased volume this time of year. Our water patrol will call you to set up an appointment once we have all the information needed.

If you have **new non-motorized** watercrafts, you will need to fill out the application online (NON-MOTORIZED APPLICATION FORM) for each watercraft you are registering. Remember, only fill out the form **if it has never been on this lake**. (Residents with existing watercraft from last year, will already have a sticker sheet on file in the office.) A copy of the declaration page of your Homeowners Insurance and safety test will be required to purchase these stickers. Tests are taken every two years, with even lots taking it in even numbered years and odd lots taking it in odd numbered years. (If you are a new resident, you will be required to take a test even it's not your year)

MOTORIZED - \$175.00

NON-MOTORIZED - \$50.00

Appointments are required so remember to call and make an appointment to get your stickers for all watercraft.

Leaving Gate Open at Boat Ramp is a Violation!!



VII. MISCELLANEOUS OPERATING RULES:

22. Boat Ramp Gate: Each resident must close and lock gate after each use to load or unload a boat onto Raintree Lake, provided there is not another resident with current sticker waiting to use the ramp. Failure to close and lock the boat ramp gate is a violation. Approved 7-10-18

The gate at the boat ramp is intended to serve as a reminder that every boater at Raintree is responsible for the health of our lake.

There are two reasons for the gate: trespassers and invasive species control. Trespassing boaters have been relatively minimal, but they cause a fair amount of concern. A locked gate is expected to send a very clear message to would-be trespassers.

The second reason, invasive species control, is a much more significant challenge that could affect all residents. The invasive species of most concern to the Lake Committee and the Board is zebra mussels. Zebra mussels can cause significant damage to boats and structures in the lake as well as injury to swimmers—all of which has the potential to reduce property values in our community.

Zebra mussels reproduce at incredible rates. A single female zebra mussel can reproduce a million eggs each year. Zebra mussels are not visible to the naked eye in their larvae stage. Zebra mussels have been identified in a number of locations in Missouri and Kansas. They have not been found in Raintree Lake at this point.

Key points to remember: CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY, DISPOSE. Cleaning with water heated to 140°F instantly kills mussels. The Boat/ Truck wash next to Casey's in Greenwood is set to a minimum of 140°F and is recommended for use by all boats that have been in infested waters prior to re-entry into Raintree Lake. In addition to cleaning and drying the boat, special attention should be paid to trailers, bilges, live wells, ballast tanks, bait buckets, fat sacks, life jackets, tubes, wakeboards, skis, ropes, wet suits and any other gear that has been in infested waters to ensure that they are thoroughly cleaned and dried as well.

Babysitter—Caregiver Pass

Babysitter Passes and Caregiver Passes are available for \$50.00 in the Raintree Office for the 2024 Pool Season. A Raintree homeowner must come to the office to fill out the necessary paperwork before a pass will be issued. The office only accepts a cash or check payment.

Raintree I.D. Troubles?

Lose your Raintree ID? Dog tear it to shreds? Sunscreen smear it into something unrecognizable? Whatever shall you do?

No need to fret, the Raintree Office can help!

To replace a ruined card, bring what is left and you will receive a replacement at no cost to you! Lost cards will be a \$5.00 charge to replace.



Pool Guest Credit Q & A

Q: How do I get Guest Credits to use at the pool?

A: Ten Guest Credits are given to each Raintree household each year These credits are loaded electronically in the office and reduced electronically by pool employees when a member of your household brings in guests.

Q: What if I run out of Guest Credits?

A: Additional Guest Credits can be purchased in the Raintree Office (NOT AT THE POOL) for \$5.00 each, in groups of 10. So for \$50.00 you will receive 10 Guest Credits. Any Guest Credits that are purchased and not used will be brought forward to the next year.

Remember that you must stay with, and are responsible for, any guest you bring to the pool.

Also, please remember that dues must be up-to-date in order to use the pool.

Current Pool Information

- ◆ The pool IS open with regular operating hours WOO HOO!!!
- Pool guests...Minor residents over 14 years old may have up to 2 guests per lot per day when unaccompanied by lot owner/lessee.
- We are putting the burden on parents to know if a child (or themselves) should be at the pool. Please do not bring anyone that has been sick until 48 hours after they feel better.
- Residents are no longer allowed to eat at the pool's edge.
- Maximum occupancy is 235 people.







Dedicated Lap Lane

Pool now has a dedicated lap lane!

Monday—Thursday from 10:30 to 12:00 pm there will be a dedicated lane for swimming laps. Children will be instructed where to swim laps and where to play.

SOME POOL RULE REMINDERS:

Rule #3: No smoking, vaping, alcoholic beverages or drugs of any kind shall be allowed in the pool area.

Rule #16: Appropriate swim attire required. Prohibited attire includes but not limited to string or thong bikinis, jean shorts, basketball shorts, bras, tanktops, swim wear that becomes see through when wet or other attire determined to be inappropriate by Pool and/or RLPOA management.

Swim Break

The last 15 minutes of each hour at the Raintree Pool have been deemed a Swim Break—which is for SAFETY REASONS. This is a time for the pool to be emptied so lifeguards can view a clear pool, take a break from their duties, hydrate and rotate positions. During this time only adults, 18 years and older, may be in the pool, and the pool manager assumes the duties of lifeguard during that time.

Those under 18 years old may sit around the perimeter of the pool only.

Although this may be inconvenient for those at the pool, it is necessary for the safety of all residents and staff.



We elect a couple of charities to donate to and we chose LS Social Services and ReHope. We collected \$50.00 for ReHope and \$300.00 for LS Social Services. It's one of my favorite events.

July is a busy month for Midwest gardens, but also a rewarding time to be outside and enjoying your garden. The month can be hot and dry, so pay attention to watering; also stay on stop of weeding, deadheading, fertilizing and pruning. Many vegetables are ready to be harvested in July, including tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, and beans. Savor your garden's bounty in this midsummer month.

Water Flowers and Lawns

Keep flowers and lawns green and healthy by making sure your landscaping gets enough water— about 1 inch a week. If using a sprinkler, set out a pan or tuna can on the lawn to collect and measure how much water falls. The best time to water is in early morning; this prevents water loss from evaporation and gives foliage daylight hours to dry to prevent disease.

Keep Weeding - Try working in the cool of morning— especially right after watering, when roots will be easier to pull—or in the evening to minimize your exposure to heat.

Deadhead Flowers - Cutting or pinching off faded blooms—keeps your landscape tidy and encourages certain flowers to bloom more.

Mulch as Needed - Spread 1-3 inches of wood chips or other weed-suppressing material now that the soil has warmed.


Container Garden Care - Water Often and Thoroughly

Container gardens usually need daily watering in hot weather, and some plants (such as fuchsia, impatiens and hibiscus) will need water twice a day. If the soil becomes dry and hard, set the container in a bowl or bucket of water for a couple of hours to rehydrate.

Remove Problem Foliage - Pinch off yellowing or problem foliage and spent flower blooms to encourage lush growth and flowers.

Fertilize Regularly - Fertilize containers every two weeks to assure growth and bloom. Use a bloom-booster fertilizer on flowering plants.



Please do not be offended or defensive if this is asked of you. Raintree residents have the right to enjoy the lake and other amenities, but since this is private property, others who are non-residents, do not have that same right and will be asked to leave, unless they are guests of a Raintree resident. Residents need only show their I.D. card and continue enjoying the lake.

Don't have a Raintree I.D. card? Stop by the office and get one—the first one is free. Replacements cost \$5.00.

LAKE CONDITIONS AND FISH POPULATIONS CHARACTERISTICS

- 1. The bass population is showing signs of declining the number of bass sampled dropped from 41% to 16% that were over 15 inches long. The size structure of the population remains good but not excellent. The body condition was still good.
- 2. The size structure of the bluegill population remains poor. All bluegill sampled were shorter than 8 inches. Most bluegill in sample ranged from 2-4 inches. Body condition of these fish was good. This population remains poor because of competition with gizzard shad for the available food.
- 3. Crappie were not capture in this sample. They had already moved to deeper water after the spawn.
- 4. Channel catfish sample was low in number, as expected in EF. The fish ranged in size from 20.3 to 23.6 inches long. Body condition was good on these fish.
- 5. Water willow was seen in good amounts and small amounts of pondweed was around the shoreline of the lake. Coontail and naiads were found growing out in the lake. Very little woody structure was observed.
- 6. Other fish observed in small numbers include green sunfish, redear sunfish, golden shiners and bullheads. Gizzard shad were found in very high numbers.
- 7. Sample timing may have been late in the year. Sample sizes and species may be bias by time of year/temperatures.



MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Continue the voluntary 12 to 15-inch slot length limit on large-mouth bass. Bass between 12-15 inches in length should be released unharmed. Harvest of the under 12-inch fish will increase the growth rate of the remaining fish and result in more fish getting to 15 inches quicker. Harvest should remain within statewide limits.
- 2. Harvest bluegill within statewide limits. No size restrictions are needed.
- 3. Crappie in subdivision lakes tend to be under harvested. From talking to the anglers this is true for Raintree. All crappie should be harvested within statewide limits.
- 4. The channel catfish population is in very good shape. Harvest of these fish can continue under statewide regulations.
- 5. With the continued development of Raintree Lake, loss of habitat along the shoreline will be the biggest problem for the fisheries of this lake. Whenever possible shoreline vegetation should be kept. Water willow, arrowhead and other plants of this type provide cover and food for young fish. This vegetation also slows shoreline erosion. If vegetation that grows above the surface of the water needs to be controlled or if the possibility of the spay getting into the water while spraying the rip-rap an approved aquatic herbicide should be used like EAGRE, AQUATIC KILLZALL OR ERASER AQ. Dry land vegetation can be controlled by ROUNDUP. The label is the law.
- 6. If the coontail gets out of control treatment should start in the spring when water temp. reaches 60 degrees and before the vegetation becomes too dense. Waiting until mid summer for herbicide treatments could result in a fish kill.
- 7. The addition of hard cover should continue. Christmas trees are OK but do not last like hard woods.
- 8. Silt basins should contain as much vegetation as possible. These plants will not only filter out silt from development, it will also reduce nutrient flow into the lake. This in turn will reduce the need for aquatic plant control in the lake and improve the water quality in the lake as well. The addition of plants like water willow, pickerel weed and fragrant water lilies could help control bacterial levels too and still allow anglers to fish.




